THE ORACLE OF OMAHA

Read the text below and answer the questions.

Warren Edward Buffett, widely known as the Oracle of Omaha, is one of the most successful and respected investors in the world. Born on August 30, 1930, in Omaha, Nebraska, Buffett's journey from a young boy interested in business to the chairman and CEO of Berkshire Hathaway, one of the largest conglomerates globally, is a remarkable tale of financial acumen and principled investing.

Buffett's fascination with business and investment began at a very young age. By the time he was 11, he had already made his first stock investment in Cities Service Preferred, a major oil company. His early interest was nurtured by his father, Howard Buffett, a stockbroker and member of Congress. Young Warren would spend countless hours reading financial books and studying the stock market.

After graduating from the University of Nebraska and Columbia Business School, Buffett worked for various investment firms before returning to Omaha in 1956. Armed with investment knowledge, he started his own investment partnership, Buffett Partnership Ltd. Over the years, he delivered astounding returns to his investors, thanks to his disciplined value investing approach.

In 1965, Buffett acquired a textile company, Berkshire Hathaway, and shifted its focus toward insurance and investments. This was a pivotal moment in his career. Under his stewardship, Berkshire Hathaway transformed into a diversified conglomerate with holdings in well-known companies like Coca-Cola, Apple, and American Express.



Buffett's investment philosophy is simple yet profound. He believes in buying businesses with enduring competitive advantages and holding them for the long term. He emphasizes the importance of intrinsic value and margin of safety, guiding principles that have yielded impressive results over decades. His annual letters to shareholders and interviews have become valuable resources for investors seeking wisdom and insight.




One of Buffett's most significant contributions is his commitment to philanthropy. In 2006, he announced plans to donate the majority of his wealth to charitable causes, primarily through the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. This decision set an example for fellow billionaires and underscored his dedication to making the world a better place.

Despite his immense wealth, Warren Buffett is known for his modest lifestyle. He lives in the same house he purchased in 1958 and prefers simple pleasures like reading, playing bridge, and enjoying Cherry Coke. He is often cited as an example of financial prudence and humility.

Throughout his life, Warren Buffett's approach to investing, ethics, and philanthropy has made him a legendary figure in the financial world. His story serves as an inspiration to aspiring investors and demonstrates the power of discipline, patience, and a long-term perspective in achieving success, both in finance and in life.

Narges Mohammadi, the recipient¹ of the 2023 Nobel Peace Prize, was born in Iran in 1972. For the past 45 years, the country has been governed by an authoritarian regime. As a consequence, the majority of his wealth is donated to charitable causes.

ANSWER THE QUESTIONS BELOW: In 2006, Buffett announced his plans to donate 31 years in jail and 154 lashes* with a whip. According to the Nobel Committee, she won the award for "her fight against the oppression of women in Iran and her efforts to promote human rights and freedom for all."

What is the key investment philosophy that Warren Buffett is known for?

Raised in a middle-class family, Mohammadi looked forward to a bright future. Everything changed after the Islamic revolution³ in 1979, when she witnessed⁴ her activist uncle and two cousins being taken away by the police on political charges. Subsequently⁵, she found herself caught up in the wave of political unrest*.

Throughout Mohammadi's life, she has faced multiple⁶ arrests. One of these occurred in 2011, when she was sentenced to 11 years in jail. After being released on bail* two years later,

Mohammadi began to campaign against the use of the death penalty*, which led to her being arrested and sentenced again in 2015. However, her time in jail hasn't stopped her efforts, and she still opposes* the regime's violence against political prisoners, especially women.

The announcement of Mohammadi being awarded the prize followed a year of protests in Iran. These activities were triggered⁹ by the death of 22-year-old Mahsa Amini, who was arrested by Iran's morality police for not wearing her headscarf* correctly in September 2022. The Nobel Committee stated that the prize was also for Amini, the 500+ demonstrators killed in protests, and the thousands who were injured. Mohammadi refuses to be silenced even in prison, and receiving the Nobel Peace Prize has only strengthened¹⁰ her resolve¹¹ to continue fighting for human rights.
